

Dr. Julia M. McNamara, President, appointed Mr. Steven Gstalder, vice president for information technology services, left, and Dr. Sean P. O'Connell, vice president for academic affairs and Dean of the Faculty, to co-chair the College's strategic planning process. In all, some 600 persons—alumni, faculty, staff, trustees, community leaders, prospective students and Dominican Sisters—shared their thoughts about Albertus in large and small group sessions, as well as one-on-one interviews. The information was sifted, studied and rigorously discussed, providing the foundation for the College's plan for the future.

PREACHING Through the Arts

Dominicans: Preaching through the Arts was the theme of the third Annual Founders' Day celebration of our founders, our heritage and our College. Sr. Thoma Swanson, O.P., internationally-acclaimed stained glass artist, and founder and former chair of the art department at Albertus, was the morning speaker on preaching through art. She describes her art as a form of teaching the Gospels, with a message behind all her work. "We realize with humility that artists are gifts from God for the community, as is the community a gift for the artists." Responders to her talk were Abbe Miller, director of the graduate art therapy program; Jerome Nevins, co-chair of the department of visual and performing arts; Annalise Chiarelli '14, a psychology major with a concentration in art therapy; and Rebecca Weinberger '15, an art major with a minor in English. At noon, in the oldest Albertus tradition the Candlelight Ceremony seniors passed the light of knowledge to new students; administration and faculty members were in full academic attire for this solemn ceremony. (A ceremony for students in the evening programs took place September 29.) Following the All-College Picnic, Sr. Amy McFrederick, O.P., co-director of Associates for the Dominican Sisters of Peace, spoke on preaching through music. She played and sang pieces she has composed to accompany the words of the Gospels, making them more accessible to people. "To be a Dominican is to be a preacher always, and all ways," she said. Following Sr. Amy's presentation, the Albertus Magnus College Chorus performed several selections. The College presented its Veritas Award to Professor Jerome Nevins in recognition of his 35 years of service. (See page 5 for his comments on teaching.)

Veritas Award

The Veritas Award is presented from time to time to those alumni and friends who personify the values, traditions and service to others, which are hallmarks of the Albertus mission.

This year, at Founders' Day, the College honored Jerome Nevins, professor of visual and performing arts and co-chair of the department of visual and performing arts, for his 35 years of dedicated service to Albertus. Accepting the award, he said: "I am grateful for the opportunity to share my love of art with students, supported by 800 years of Dominican search for truth and meaning. The Dominican motto, "Contemplata aliis tradere,' to give to others the fruits of one's contemplation is drawn from the writings of St. Thomas Aquinas, and encompasses vocation, work and spirituality simultaneously. This ideal has sustained me for the last 35 years and has reminded me to always return to the deep well of contemplation, to nourish my energy and enthusiasm for the challenging work of teaching undergraduates....

"I believe that excellence in teaching begins with having a profound respect for the integrity and honest intent of every student. Each must find his or her own voice. Each must feel secure enough in the classroom to take risks, make mistakes, feel encouraged by successes and derive energy from a supportive, cooperative classroom environment....

"Most of my students will not become artists; that is not their intent, nor mine. For many, the language of art is something completely new to them. How can art be important to the athlete, the business major, the tired mom working two jobs and trying to get a degree? What can it say to them? How can it expand their world and deepen their experience? This is how I approach my work here at Albertus....

"I'd like to think that I succeed in opening minds to new possibilities. Some students find a new talent and develop a passion they never expected to have. More often, they discover, sometimes to their surprise (and disappointment), that art is hard work. It is in the doing, the thinking, the trying and trying again, that our lives are enriched....

"Teaching here has enriched my life in ways I could not have foreseen 35 years ago when I began. I am grateful for the support of my colleagues and grateful for the privilege of working with students to help them discover beauty in art, to see light more deeply and to discover truth that is felt and personal."

Nearly half of the traditional day program—253 out of 540 students— is involved in the College's athletics program. Seventeen of 18 transfer students who enrolled this fall did so because they wanted to be on an Albertus team. A member of the NCAA's Division III, Albertus competes in the Great Northeast Athletic Conference, and currently fields 12 teams; men's and women's golf teams, now club sports, will begin intercollegiate competition next year. ARTS at Albertus

n 1970 Sr. Thoma Swanson, O.P., officially established a major in art at Albertus Magnus College and served as its first chairperson. Since then hundreds of art majors have gone on to post-graduate study, teach at all educational levels, establish careers in commercial and fine arts, and art-related professions. Sculptors, artists, graphic designers, art therapists, digital designers—Albertus alumni continue to pursue the centuries-old Dominican motto of "Contemplata aliis tradere"—to give to others the fruits of one's contemplation—sharing their talents through their art.

Today at Albertus, the visual and performing arts department is co-chaired by Julia Coash, professor of studio art and art history, and Jerome Nevins, professor of visual and performing arts. Department programs combine the humanistic offerings of a liberal arts college, with a broad and integrated training in the arts.

Nevins recently received the College's Veritas Award for his 35 years of service to the art department and arts at Albertus. (See page 5.)

For Coash, her role as teacher is "to encourage students to reflect on how ideas, values and materials from their personal lives and interests could be a source of inspiration in their studies and their studio work." She also is the chairperson of the Master of Arts in Liberal Studies program at Albertus. Recently returned from doing sabbatical research on calligraphy in Vietnam, Cambodia and Laos, Coash has exhibited her work in Bermuda, Paris, Cairo and throughout the United States.

Albertus student Rebecca Weinberger is a member of the class of 2015, and has been intrigued by art for as long as she can remember. In high school she heard about art therapy from an art teacher, and knew that this was the field she wanted.

"This was my path, my plan," she says, "and I have followed it. I will graduate with an art therapy major and a minor in English. My art makes me feel whole and calm. Art takes passion, you must really want to do it. I think everyone can be an artist in some way; if not through painting, then maybe through words or sculpture."

After graduation in May, Weinberger plans to continue at Albertus to get her master's in art therapy and to work with young adults who have autism.

Dear Alumni and Friends of Albertus,

Last year in my report to you, I shared information about an exciting process taking place here at Albertus Magnus College. At the time, we were engaged in developing strategic plan recommendations that would guide this institution, as it approaches the 90th anniversary of its founding in 1925, for many years to come. This endeavor went beyond the opinions of just a few participants; it was, indeed, a truly collaborative effort to sustain and build upon the liberal arts foundation and the Catholic, Dominican roots of Albertus.

We were committed to learning from those who knew us well, and from some who didn't. In all, some 600 persons—alumni, faculty, students, staff, trustees, community leaders, prospective students and the Dominican Sisters who continue to sponsor Albertus—gave of their time and told us, always candidly, how they thought the viability and vitality of the College could be ensured. They offered observations, out-of-the-box thinking and creative recommendations for ways in which Albertus could flourish in the future.

From these sessions, and from rigorous discussion among our Administrative Council, faculty and staff, Albertus 2020: A Strategic Path for the 21st Century evolved. This plan focuses on five initiatives that we believe will expand our horizons, while maintaining our core Dominican values of study, prayer, community and service. The Board of Trustees approved Albertus 2020 in June of this year.

The five initiatives are: commit to the development of in-demand and high-impact academic programs; implement innovative and distinctive delivery of academic services; enhance our capacity for technological innovation and human creativity; promote strong athletic programs; and celebrate our inclusive and diverse community. I hope you will take a few minutes to read more about these initiatives, and how they will be carried out,



Percentage of Dollars for 2013-2014 Fiscal Year





eteran students at Albertus find a welcoming environment. A participant in the Post 9/11 GI Bill Yellow Ribbon Program, Albertus works closely with veterans to help them succeed in accelerated programs.

Experience counts for veterans who pursue an undergraduate or graduate degree at Albertus, which considers academic credits for military training, standardized tests, and transfer of credit from other colleges and universities. Albertus supports students with small classes—the faculty/student ratio is 1:14—and with individualized student services, such as academic advisement, career counseling and tutoring.

Veterans often return to college uniquely qualified to excel in an academically challenging environment. They have practical experience overcoming obstacles to achieve their goals.

For veterans and other adult learners, Albertus offers several flexible, accelerated undergraduate and graduate degree programs to accommodate their busy schedules. Degrees are offered in such fields as business, criminal justice, human services, leadership and more. For veterans with an interest in the arts, more traditional semester-based

Accounting at Albertus

ccounting is now a hot job choice, and it's one of today's in-demand, high-impact programs being developed under Albertus 2020: A Strategic Path for the 21st Century. The Bachelor of Science in accounting, the Master of Science in accounting and the five-year Bachelor of Science in accounting/Master of Business Administration degree programs are new offerings this fall.



There are more choices in the field of accounting than ever before. Career options include forensic accountant, IRS agent, FBI agent, budget analyst, certified public accountant and jobs in the financial services industry. The Connecticut department of labor expects a 16% growth in accounting positions with an average salary of \$61,900; the Bureau of Labor Statistics projects a 15.7% growth for accountants between 2010 and 2020; and the American Institute of Certified Public Accounts, in a 2013 study, found that hiring by public accounting firms is at an all-time high, especially at the Master's degree level.

There are many advantages to studying accounting at Albertus, among them day and evening classes, flexible scheduling, blended curriculum with online and classroom experiences, small class sizes, diverse student population and professors who have both academic qualifications and real world experience. Accounting students here receive an education that prepares them to advance professionally, and challenges them to pursue truth in all its dimensions, to explore ethical issues and to apply knowledge, skills and values to their chosen field.

Remembering Sr. Charles Marie (Gloria) Brantl, O.P., '51

Sr. Charles Marie Brantl, O.P., beloved teacher, leader in higher education and "Sister Chuck" to countless Albertus Magnus College students, died on August 21, 2014, in Columbus, Ohio.

An economics major, Sr. Charles Marie graduated from Albertus in 1951, and was professed as a Dominican Sister of St. Mary of the Springs (now the Dominican Sisters of Peace) in 1953. 
